# THE HISTORIC OCTAGON HOUSE OF MOSCOW ROAD

The Octagon House was built in 1889 on Moscow Road by Mr. McLachlan, an architect from San Francisco. He designed a similar structure, the McElroy House on Gough Street in San Francisco, now a national historic site.


Although the heartwood redwood used to construct McLachlan's Victorian cottage was undoubtedly obtained locally, many of the other materials were brought by ferry and rail from San Francisco, as were the artisans hired to construct the house.

The McLachlans used the house as a summer getaway for approximately 35 years, hosting parties for their friends traveling from San Francisco for galas on the river. Revelers would take the ferry to San Quentin Station, board the narrow-gauge train heading to Duncans Mills and then disembark the train directly in front of the house. Boating was always a popular amusement for guests and a boathouse was located on the property.

Later, McLachlan's cousin and spouse, John and Elizabeth Prior, summered in the house for another 30 years. The Priors owned a business in San Francisco making yacht sails, bags and anything canvas, and they placed awnings on the building to protect it from the hot summer sun.

Mary Robert Griesbach was the home's third owner, from 1965-1994. She and her husband added two corners and a back porch to the original octagon shape and enclosed a side porch to create a windowed sunroom. They also built an "in-law" unit on the footprint of the old boathouse and installed a big bathroom and small bedroom in the attic of the main house.

Since 1994, the owner has been Christina Harrison, the first owner to live in the house full-time. Among other



talents, Christina is an antiques dealer, and she has focused on preserving and restoring the home to its original Victorian style.

The Octagon House gardens were originally designed by horticulturist John McClaren, a crony of McLachlan's and best known as the man who created Golden Gate Park in San Francisco. The house's garden paths and many of McLaren's original trees and plants still grace the yard, but diminishing sun – due to the growing redwoods – has changed the makeup of plants in the garden.

# **PPP RESTORATION WORK COMPLETED 2012-13**



The birds are back and the restoration work on Patterson Point Preserve for the 2012-13 season is now complete. If you have not been on the Preserve for a while, you may notice some significant changes.

Near the entrance, the invasive ivy, plum saplings and Chinese dawn redwoods have been removed and a temporary demonstration area has been created to inform visitors about native plants and bird nesting environments. The area along the main path, previously infested with ivy, is now dotted with redwood sorrel and ferns that will fill in over the next few years. The ivy above the sand beach has been removed and replaced with more sedge plants, the roots of which were used by the Pomo indigenous people for basket weaving.

Plans for restoration work starting this fall will be discussed at the community meeting on July 6; all are welcome!

We appreciate the effort that our community volunteers have put into the Preserve throughout the cold winter months. Thank you!


