It's the start of bird nesting season so we have packed away the shovels and tarps from another winter-long effort to restore the Preserve. An article summarizing the extraordinary efforts of the restoration volunteers and our paid stewards follows.

We have negotiated a new contract with Amerigas, providing three more years of propane discounts for FoVG members. A series of strategic planning sessions have resulted in some organizational changes. We have established a Membership

Committee to deal with member development and benefits, including the propane contract. A Recreation Committee will now focus on more "fun" events for members and the community throughout the year.

Please join us at the upcoming membership meeting on July 5 to help guide us in developing the organization in 2016.

PATTERSON POINT PRESERVE RESTORATION UPDATE

The 2014-15 restoration season saw real progress, focusing on the trailhead and eastern boundary. After the restoration plan was presented at last July's community meeting, work commenced in mid-September with the end of the bird nesting season.

Over 21 cubic yards of ivy and invasive blackberries were removed, and where the weeds and grasses were too dense, volunteers sheet-mulched the area to stop their spread. Along the eastern boundary, meticulous detangling work successfully separated the invasive plants from the natives. The boundary area was then planted with native shrubs and trees

which, when full-sized, will provide a dense green living wall of valuable bird nesting habitat.

In the utility area, panels constructed from recycled redwood stakes and tree branches were installed to screen the trash bins, portable toilet and tool box. In addition, new information panels and a donation box are being prepared for installation before the start of the summer season.

Elsewhere on the preserve, work continued on removing invasives, especially on the trail towards the rocky beach. In all, volunteers spent over 400 hours working this past season!

A REMEMBRANCE OF VILLA GRANDE BY WARREN PAYNE

John Fredrick Heinbockel built the "Here 'Tis" house at 21899 West Street in the late 1920s. His son Wayne, the youngest of three boys, and his wife Martha inherited the house and subsequently purchased the adjacent property from a Mr. Varney. That lot, which sits between the "Here 'Tis" and the current Villa Grande post office, included three conjoined cabins and was called the "3-in-1", and is currently owned by Don Test.

Wayne and Martha lived in Alameda and would spend many weekends at the "Here 'Tis" and "3-in-1" maintaining the places by day and relaxing in the afternoons and evenings. Their daughter Marilyn (my mother), married my father George Payne in 1955. My siblings and I spent many weekends as young kids with our parents and grandparents in Villa Grande - it was truly a magical place for us.

One of my fondest memories is of my grandmother, Martha, giving me and my younger sister, Janice, spare change after barbecue dinners so we could go to the Villa Grande store to buy candy and ice cream bars. Often times I would buy a toy balsa airplane instead, which usually ended up stuck high in a nearby redwood tree!
