PATTERSON POINT RESTORATION UPDATE

March was not only the end of the restoration season at Patterson Point Preserve, but it also marked the completion of our grant from the Sonoma County Agricultural Preservation and Open Space District.

Received in 2009, the grant helped fund the acquisition of the Preserve and also provided money to develop the Master Plan and

make headway on initial restoration efforts. Those efforts are paying off, with ivy no longer climbing the trees and the main path now lined with native understory plants.

Other changes in-

clude the removal of the large invasive plum tree, planting of an elderberry in its place, and a total reconstruction of the entrance utility area. With the recently added red-

DISTRICT 5 CANDIDATES FORUM

On April 21, FoVG sponsored a forum for the 5 candidates running to replace Efren Carillo as our representative on the Sonoma Board of Supervisors. The candidates were presented a list of issues of interest to local residents and each was given a chance to respond. The event was held at the Old Hotel, with about 45 community members attending. As a 501(c)(3) public benefit organization, FoVG cannot endorse candidates, but encourages everyone to become informed and vote on June 7.

FIREHOUSE AND PLAZA RESTORATION (CONT'D)

The old Villa Grande firehouse (still) needs some urgent care and attention. As described in the last Newsletter (#18), FoVG has already invested volunteer time and money on basic repairs. Since then we have acquired a permit from the County to stabilize the building and bring in electric service. This will allow us to add a dehumidifier and hook up lights for events at the Plaza.

After consulting professionals, we have determined that the cost of repair and improvements could be up to \$25,000. The Board has authorized \$12,500 to match donations for this project, and already members of the community have stepped up with more than \$1,500. We have also applied for a \$2,000 matching grant from the Russian River Com-

munity Trust of the Community Foundation of Sonoma. If you would like to contribute to this effort, please contact Roberto or make your tax-deductible donation through the crowd-funding page at villagrande.org/firehouse. A fundraising party is planned for Saturday, July 9, across the street from the firehouse.

There will also be a discussion at the July 2 FoVG membership town hall to solicit ideas on potential uses of the Firehouse Plaza. Some early suggestions include a stage for the talent show and community meetings, a barbecue, picnic tables and a dog park. Come to the Town Hall meeting on July 2 and give us your ideas for the use of the Plaza.

BYLAWS UPDATE

PROPANE DELIVERY OPTIONS CLARIFIED

The propane discount program has been in operation for more than 6 years, saving FoVG members some serious money. The membership committee has been clarifying contract details with our supplier, Amerigas, that impact delivery options and subscribers now have a choice:

Will Call When your tank is down to the 20-25% mark, give Amerigas a call. They need at least 7, preferably 10 days' notice, so adjust accordingly. If you run out of gas, they can make a special trip, which costs \$100 weekdays or \$150 on the weekend.

Keep Full Amerigas automatically fills your tank on a regular delivery schedule. If they

misjudge and your tank runs dry, they will refill it right away and rebate \$25 for your troubles. You may end up without gas for a day or two, however.

With either delivery option, Amerigas will leave a receipt on the day of the delivery. If you are not present, the receipt will be placed near the tank, or you can let them know if you prefer a different location.

This past winter there were issues with both programs when our long-time driver Paco left the company, and it took a while for a new driver to learn the routes. Please let us know if you're having problems with your propane delivery at friends@villagrande.org.

CALIFORNIA BLACKBERRY (RUBUS URSINUS) Rubus ursinus is a wide, mounding shrub or vine, growing to 2–5 feet high, and more than 6 feet wide. The prickly branches can take root if they touch soil, enabling the plant to spread and form larger clonal colonies. In Patterson Point Preserve, these native berries are overrun by the aggressive non-native Himalayan blackberry (Rubus armeniacus).
