### **BIRDS OF PATTERSON POINT**

One spring, I was canoeing past a gravel beach on the Russian River that was drying out after being under the winter waters. A movement caught my eye, and I could see these fluffy little tennis-ball sized things scurrying around. Before the beach was out of sight as I floated past, I was able to identify the moving objects as baby Killdeer—a bird that's a member of the Plover family. Mom and Dad were nearby supervising their chicks.

While Killdeer nest on rocky or gravelly ground, other birds prefer to nest in the dense tangles of bushes or in a hollow log. Some birds burrow into the banks of the Russian River

to nest, some excavate a cavity in a tree trunk, and yet others build nests by slapping sticky mud against a rock face (or even your house) and molding it into a domed home. Many song birds build the quintessential nest in a tree, shaped like a cup and built from grasses, bark and

twigs. We've all enjoyed the large Osprey nest on top of a dead snag across from Patterson Point Preserve. If the Ospreys continue to nest there, they'll probably add onto it, like a yearly remodel.

As a place for birds to nest, Patterson Point Reserve provides excellent habitat for a large variety of species. There are 70

different species that nest in the Villa Grande area. How many of these birds nest on the Preserve itself, we're not sure, but for the next five years, we will be participating in the Sonoma County breeding bird survey and will develop a list of birds that nest specifically on our land. Over the past ten years, I've documented 108 bird species around Villa Grande.

Since birds can nest anywhere from the ground to high up in a redwood tree, we have to set limits on the time we spend removing invasive plants in Patterson Point Preserve so that we do not disturb nesting birds. We create enough of a ruckus on the paths and the beaches as it is. Be aware that as we remove the ivy and blackberries, we are changing the habitat. And as the native plants return, this is another habitat change making it difficult for bird species that are less flexible. You can do your part by staying on the paths and being alert to the fact that we are sharing this wonderful place with birds and other critters.

When you're on the Preserve this spring and summer, listen for the woodpeckers drumming for mates; watch for the birds that nest under a slab of loose tree bark or those that affix their nest to the trunk of a tree. Keep your eyes peeled, and perhaps you'll spot a hummingbird nest usually made of spider webbing so it will stretch to accommodate the nestlings. And if you're really lucky, maybe you'll see baby Killdeer on our gravel beach. For an up to date log of bird happenings go to villagrande.org/Bird\_Report
